# **Gardener required**

Our current gardener has given the club advance notice of his retirement and therefore a replacement is required. The current gardening contract is for 8 hours per week to maintain the gardens around the clubhouse and carpark. #### Financial information

The following information is provided following questions from members regarding the extent of the loans from NatWest.

At the AGM held on 20th August 2024 the members voted to approve an offer to increase our NatWest loan from approx. £70,000 to £180,000 and to increase the term to 20 years with flexible repayments facilities. The annual cost would reduce from circa £58,250 to £18,150 and the interest rate from 3.62% above the bank's base rate variable to 3.15% variable.


The purpose of this additional funding was to provide working capital and to enable the club to install essential drainage on the front nine. The reduced annual cost provides a significant boost to the club's finances.

NatWest Then agreed to increase the loan to £200,000 generating a further £20,000 of additional cash at a reduce interest rate of 2.5% above the base rate which meant that the annual cost remained unchanged. This was as excellent offer, and the Board gave the go ahead. The members can rest assured that all this extra cash will be used wisely to benefit the club either by installing more drainage or by helping to offset reduced income.
