So for the first time in 18 years, I was able to be back on an actual golf course and playing a hole. I cannot understate just what an amazing feeling this was, and how grateful I am the club and the members we crossed path with yesterday. I never felt judged or like I shouldn't be there.

It was somewhat comical being perched on 3 foam blocks, trying to swing a club and not topple off. But it worked and it felt amazing.

For someone who was always very active and has had to find new ways of staying active. It was just so good to be outside and swinging away at some golf balls.

Hopefully I can find some way to continue this momentum and get back to playing regularly again in some form another.

So I pass on my heartfelt thanks to everyone, especially Mark, and hope you keep helping support the Battleback centre.
